

OHT PRIMARY CARE CHECKLIST -2023/2024 FALL & WINTER RESPIRATORY PREPAREDNESS

The Fall/Winter Respiratory Preparedness Primary Care Checklist provides OHT and their Primary Care OHT Clinical Leads and Primary Care OHT Committees with a simple checklist as you develop more fulsome OHT fall winter preparedness plans for 2023/2024. The Checklist is meant for primary care sites such as Family Health Teams, Nurse Practitioner Led Clinics, Community Health Centres, Family physicians, pharmacies, home care agencies/ Home & Community Support Services working in partnership with Local Public Health Units, Community Paramedics, Hospitals & Long-Term Care Homes.

CHECKLIST for PRIMARY CARE	
	Review primary care preparedness planning for 2023/2024 respiratory fall/ winter season relative to flu, RSV, COVID and pneumonia in consultation with local Public Health Unit and local pharmacies at the OHT Primary Care Coordinating Table (or alternative). Discuss approaches to ongoing situational awareness and communications between providers throughout fall/ winter respiratory season especially related to primary care impacts.
	Discuss and confirm vaccination plans for flu, COVID, RSV, and pneumonia. Confirm pharmacy locations for vaccines, booking process and hours of operation including how these will be communicated to the public and primary care organizations and physician offices. Confirm vaccine delivery and patient/ staff vaccination availability in primary care offices.
	Identify key Primary care human resource issues that might arise and ways to address this including significant primary care practitioner, clinical or support staff illness within primary care organizations.
	Assess inventory of resources to support staffing needs: PPE supply including masks, gloves, and hand sanitizer. Review IPAC resources and local public health unit phone/ email Ensure awareness of local pathways/access points for local COVID/ Flu/ RSV vaccine
	Identify high-risk primary care clients (such as seniors or vulnerable patients) and ensure care plans are up to date. Discuss clinical strategies related to persons who do not have primary care practitioner such as persons who are/ at risk of homelessness and how care could be provided during fall/ winter.
	Discuss how stepped care can assist throughout seasonal flu/Covid/ RSV outbreaks.
	Reviewing current testing eligibility and any applicable MOH guidance documents. Ensure awareness of available access points for testing (i.e., pharmacies).
	Discuss how therapeutics (Tamiflu, Paxlovid and Remdesivir) will be available to primary care practitioners.
	Update Primary Care organization web site including after-hours availability and virtual care appointments.
	Review and update staff and patient masking protocols for onsite visits at the primary care site. Review and update signage/web site information on masking as respiratory outbreaks in your community change.
	Discuss fall/ winter preparedness with local Long Term Care Homes i f primary care physician or NP currently provide services or if additional Human resources might be requested by LTCH during outbreaks.
	Discuss with hospitals and OHT the need for general public communication strategy for when to go to ED and when to call primary care practitioner or Health 811.
	Review with OHT Primary Care Lead how to seek help if your office or primary care organization is overwhelmed.

	Review Ontario Health Memo: Supports for the Fall/Winter Respiratory Illness Season (October 13, 2023)
