The Oxford County Community Health Centre's (OCCHC) Tillsonburg Point of Access serves individuals residing in Tillsonburg and surrounding areas who are vulnerable and/or marginalized, and experiencing barriers to accessing care. The OCCHC was recently awarded NEW funding to Expand our existing team in Tillsonburg; this is an evolving position on a growing team. We are seeking a **permanent, full time**:

### ***NURSE PRACTITIONER – Primary Care - Tillsonburg***

**Overview of Position:** The NP will be highly involved in the implementation process with the support of the OCCHC team – developing procedures, processes, and workflows while establishing a roster of primary care clients. The NP will be highly autonomous, and will work in close collaboration with the interdisciplinary team, with consultative support from a physician.

As a member of our broad interdisciplinary team, the NP will provide comprehensive primary care services to registered clients with a focus on those who are high risk and/or experiencing barriers to accessing services. The NP Primary Care is responsible for health assessments, diagnosis, therapeutics, health education /counselling, disease prevention, & other medical functions within full scope of practice. The role may also include Street Outreach, on a limited basis.

**Compensation & Benefits:** HOOPP pension, benefits; and paid vacation, sick and personal time.

**Hours of Work:** Monday – Friday, 8:30am – 4:30 pm.

**Location:** The Livingston Centre, Tillsonburg.

**Anticipated Start Date:** November 4th, 2024.

#### **Requirements:**

- Master's Degree in Nursing with a Primary Care NP designation or Baccalaureate Nursing degree with an extended class diploma, from a recognized university.
- Current Registration as an RN-EC and a member in good standing with the CNO.
- *Preference will be given to candidates with:*
  - Demonstrated experience and comfort-level working with vulnerable populations including individuals with mental health challenges, substance use disorder, experiencing homelessness, etc.
  - Demonstrated ability to work independently and collaboratively within an interprofessional team.
  - Community experience, preferably in primary health care or combination of community, hospital and/or public health.
  - Strong communication & interpersonal skills, combined with excellent critical thinking, problem solving and organizational skills.
  - Strong aptitude for "meeting clients where they are at" – assisting clients in directing their own journey.
  - Strong computer skills including previous experience with an Electronic Health Record (PS Suite an asset).
