Nurse Practitioner (NP)

The Ingersoll Nurse Practitioner-Led Clinic, in collaboration with the Oxford Ontario Health Team (OHT), is currently recruiting a temporary full-time (1.0 FTE) Nurse Practitioner or two temporary part-time (0.5 FTE) Nurse Practitioners to provide primary care services for Oxford County residents who currently do not have access to a primary care provider. The Nurse Practitioner will work in the new temporary clinic to provide timely access to acute, chronic, and preventive care for individuals without a family doctor or nurse practitioner. This clinic aims to enhance access to quality care and alleviate strain on local emergency departments by providing timely primary care services.

The position is located in the beautiful town of Tillsonburg, working with a Registered Practitioner Nurse (RPN) and a Medical Office Administrator (MOA). Training, support, and mentorship are available through the Ingersoll Nurse Practitioner-Led Clinic site.

This role has the potential to become permanent based on expansion and future funding.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Nurse Practitioner role includes the following core responsibilities:

- Provide timely comprehensive primary health care, including acute, chronic and preventative care, for unattached residents of Oxford County
- Provide care that upholds the Standards of Practice: Nurse Practitioner (College of Nurses of Ontario) and the Canadian Nurse Practitioner Core Competency Framework (Canadian Nurses Association);
- Provides care that is based on evidence-based practice and quality standards within the context of a philosophy of nursing;
- Promote and participates in an interdisciplinary team model
